Street Cleansing Letter presented from the Secretary H.D.C. stating that the Street Cleaner will not be withdrawn from grass cutting duties. Letter presented from the Technical Officer stating that grass cutting will still be done by the Thirsk Street Cleaner, that plastic bin liners are being provided for stall holders to deposit their rubbish and that the number of litter bins on the Millgate Car Park has been increased by two on a permanent basis. It was agreed to keep this matter under review.

Old Bakery Nothing reported.

Post Office Alley to White Swan Yard

stating that the problems of traffic management in this area have been discussed and advice sought from the County Surveyor. Other inter-related problems have come to light such as complaints concerning the parking of heavy goods vehicles. It is considered that a further Order regulating parking and the traffic management of the Market Place will be required and at the time the Order is made, regard will be had to the problem in the vicinity of the Post Office.

Roberts 'that the H.D.C. be told that Thirsk Town Council will not participate in their policy with regard to leasing open spaces at this time.' Agreed.

Report on Cemetery Sub Committee Meeting The Chairman reported that the Garden of Rest area had been seeded and should be in good order by September. A new grass cutter is urgently required. Prop. Coun. Murkett, sec. Coun. Whitton 'that the best quotation be accepted for an 18" 5 H.P. hand propelled mower'. Agreed. The Chairman had obtained a quotation of approximately £53.00 for three copies of an anodised aluminium notice to be fixed on the Cemetery gates or railings with the wording 'The Cemetery will be open to the public from 8.00 a.m. until one hour after sunset. The Superintendent is authorised to remove any person guilty of misbehaviour. Dogs not admitted except on allead.' It was agreed that such a notice would be adequate and should be obtained.

Report on Play Equipment on The Holmes An external report received from Chas. Wicksteed stated that 1 cradle swing seat, 2 flat seats and 2 end stops for the parallel bars are or will be required within the next twelve months. As all replacement part orders are subject to a minimum charge of £20.00 it was agreed to purchase all the required parts at a total cost of £24.09. The report also stated that the equipment would benefit from being rubbed down and repainted, the grass should be removed from around the support tubes and the ground requires attention due to erosion of surface. It was agreed that these matters are in hand as repainting has taken place, Mr. Martin is cutting the grass around the supports and it is hoped that the Scouts will be making up the ground around the equipment.

Chief Inspector Brittain agreed to make known to the Chief Constable the views of the Councils and suggested another meeting in six months time to review the situation.

Apologies for Absence received from Coun. Mrs. F. M. Roberts.

Minutes The Clerk read the Minutes of the 1982 Annual Assembly to the meeting.

Matters Arising from the Minutes

Market Place Coun. Whitton asked if information is available as to the amount paid to members of the public in compensation for accidents caused by the

dangerous state of the Market Place. Prop. Coun. Whitton, sec. Coun. Allenby 'to request itemised lists of the amounts paid out in compensation for accidents occuring on the Market Place and footways up to 1st March 1983.' Agreed. The Chairman stated that £1,500 had been spent on Market Place repairs during the past year.

Chairman's Report The Chairman spoke of the new housing development taking place in the parish and the re-development of old property especially that at the old bakery premises now known as Riverside Mews. Special mention was made of the proposed industrial estate, an area of 17 acres, at present in Bagby parish but with the probability of being in Thirsk when the boundaries change. It is hoped that many new jobs will be created. Coun. Craig was thanked for his support over the acquisition of the industrial estate. The Chairman stated that it will be necessary for work to be carried out on the Greens to improve their appearance.

Reports from School Governors

All Saints' R.C. School Mrs. Greensit submitted a written report mentioning the school's curriculum, activities and charities. Letter of thanks to be sent for an interesting report.

Thirsk County Primary School Coun. Craig reported on class sizes, school activities and extra curricular activities. The P.T.A. pay for the swimming sessions and three boys had been awarded silver medals for Personal Survival. It was agreed to send a letter of congratulation on these awards. Members were concerned at the size of classes and that the building will be unable to accommodate the anticipated increase in school population due to all the new building taking place in the parish. It was agreed to write to the County Education Officer asking if there are plans to increase the size of school accommodation.

Sowerby County Primary School No report was available due to Coun. Robers' absence.

Charities Coun. Craig reported that £48.00 had been distributed.

Report on the Cemetery Coun. Kirk reported that the rubbish compound needs clearing Mr. Shipton to be asked to do this. The Garden of Rest appears
to be completed. Consideration should be given to having the gravestones straightened
where the trees were felled five years ago. The footpaths need surveying. The old
bier needs overhauling - as was previously agreed.

Town Hall

Coun. Ellis reported a reasonably successful year for the Town Hall. It is hoped to have the outside painted under a Youth Opportunities or Manpower Services Scheme. Some members considered that the rental charges are too high.

Any Other Business

Post Office Mr. Bickers suggested that the unused Clinic and Annexe could be a suitable site for a Post Office sorting office and that the present one would then make a street level Post Office. It was agreed to seek the observations of the Head Postmaster on this suggestion.

The Greens Mr. Palliser enquired how much had been spent on the upkeep of the Greens in the past few years, and stated that the kerbs and roadways need repairing. Heavy lorries are being parked on St. James' Green. It was agreed to ask the police to take any necessary action against the offenders. Prop. Coun. Craig, sec. Coun. Allenby 'to reinstate the roadways with gravel, replace the large marker stones and have them painted white, and generally tidy up The Greens.' Agreed.

Matters Arising

Old Bakery Development and Mill Gardens

The Clerk reported that the account for advertising is being paid by the Council and reimbursement will be made by the developers' solicitor. Members agreed to meet on site to discuss the reinstatement of the Mill Gardens. a representative of the developers to be invited to attend. Coun. Whitton reported that the Round Table is interested in giving assistance with the Mill Gardens.

Recreation Land - Hambleton Estate

Letter presented from the Chief Executive H.D.C.

stating that the Kettlewell Trust would not be
prepared to indemnify the Council or the Town Council as lessee, against any costs in
maintaining the watercourse but it may be possible to negotiate a direct covenant
between Barratts and the Council in this respect. The Chief Executive asked if the
Town Council would be prepared to proceed if it is possible to negotiate such a
covenant. Members agreed that they would be prepared to proceed providing that the
covenant is between Barratts and the Hambleton District Council. A letter presented
from Wells Gundall who are acting for the Liquidator of Barkers (Ryebeck Farms) Ltd
I.V.L. stated that their Client is prepared to enter into negotiations to sell the
land, Field O.S. 3459, at open market value. The Clerk stated that the letter had been
forwarded to the Chief Executive H.D.C.

Vehicle Park

The Chairman reported that new signs, prohibiting the parking of heavy goods vehicles, have been erected at the entrances to the vehicle park and the police are taking action against offenders.

Pigeons Nothing reported.

Wooden Cross - Cemetery It was reported that the grave space has now been purchased.

Bus Shelter The Divisional Technical Officer had notified the Clerk that estimates for replacement windows of unbreakable material are being obtained. Consideration is being given to having the bus shelter painted.

Disc Parking Coun. Allenby handed in a petition against the introduction of Disc Parking. The Chairman stated that this would be kept on file until a reply is received from the H.D.C. A reply to the Chamber of Trade's enquiry about the replacement of the grassed areas in the Car Park was read to the meeting. The Planning Officer accepted that the question of additional parking space in Thirsk should be given serious thought and he would take up the matter with the Technical Officer.

Members agreed to support the Chamber of Trade's suggestion regarding the replacement of the grassed areas and considered that the large verges could be replaced by small ones.

Street Lighting and Signposting - Sutton Road Letter presented from the Technical Officer stating that it is not the Council's policy to illuminate street name plates. He suggested that it would be advisable to have a new name plate headed Hambleton Estate showing all the street names within the older part of the estate at the Sutton Road entrance and at the Long Street entrance a plate headed Hambleton Drive with all the other streets, including those within the new Barratt development, listed. He agreed that it is necessary to carry out a survey of the estate with a view to erecting new name plates showing relevant house numbers etc. and consideration will be given to it. After consideration, the members agreed that they would prefer to see new large signs indicating the Hambleton Estate only at both entrances to the estate and that the Technical Officer be asked to proceed with the survey of the estate.

Letter presented from the County Surveyor stating that there is no requirement for a speed limit sign to be illuminated if there is no street lamp within 50 metres of the sign and where non-illuminated signs are manufactured from a reflective material and there does not appear to be any justification for illuminating the signs on Stockton Road.

District Events - Publicity Coun. Whitton had approached James Herriott who had told him that whilst he is still in practice he cannot allow his name to be used for advertising or publicity purposes.

Seats outside Barclays Bank Letter presented from Inspector Gargan stating that his Officers are aware of the situation and are paying it

close attention.

Obstruction on Public Footpath

Letter presented from the Footpaths Officer stating that the route is a public footpath for use by pedestrians only and is not obstructed for them. The barrier and signs were erected with the department's knowledge and after consultation.

Coun. Murkett had to leave the meeting to keep an appointment and Coun. Kirk took the Chair.

Proposed Footpath Diversion Copy of a Public Notice received from the H.D.C. regarding a proposed footpath diversion at Dowber Way.

Street Sweeping Notice received from the Treasurer H.D.C. that the first estimate for Street Sweeping 1983/84 is £1,400.00.

Restaurant Licence Notice received of Mr. T. Singh's intention to apply for a Restaurant Licence for 'Stonebrough', Stockton Road, Thirsk.

Off-Licence Notice received of Mr. D. Whittingham's intention to apply for a Justices' 'Off-Licence' in respect of No. 87, Market Place, Thirsk.
